NEW BUSINESS

1. Robyn Chaplin Debrief

- Feedback that FSA organization was good, venue excellent and canteen the best!
- Noted that there were some difficulties with running comps to time DT responsibility. Some discussion as to whether the AFF moves competition management and DT duties to the host state in the future.
- Suggestions for 2018 and onwards:
 - Better use of road crew needed, (ie. who does what), including some succession planning for new crew members.
 - Appoint a technical manager under Leon to take over hands on duties?
 - Ensure there is a new Weapons Check supervisor in 2018 so the same people don't always perform this duty.
 - Stocktake list required for items borrowed from clubs for the comp, and to cover items taken from Scotch.
 - Request noted for warm-up piste in bag room, with scoring boxes
 - Wineries to be approached for sponsorship. Piste sponsorship by businesses to be followed up.
 - New banners needed
 - Boost massage attendance by offering bookings pre event, and provide screens. WILL CONSULT THIS LIST FOR PRE-PLANNING EVENT IN 2018.

2. Faulty FSA Lame Pistes

- 2 lame pistes are damaged, 2 ok still.
- AFF has alloy pistes in Canberra which we may be able to borrow at no charge for future Robyn Chaplin events.

• Only cost would be transport, which is more cost effective than buying 2 more pistes. ACTION: Bruce to contact AFF

4. Possible provision of a new vacation program

5. Disciplinary Action

- Nature of complaint was the witnessing of inappropriate language and behaviour directed at a minor during a fencing bout at a FSA State Fencing Competition.
- FSA Child Safe Environment Policy and Member Protection Policy outline our need to manage the situation.
- Behaviour not pointed out by referee at the time, so FIE rules do not apply.
- Child Safe Policy options are mediation or tribunal: agreed that mediation was the best first option to explore. If it is refused, we will move onto a tribunal.
- Mediation needs to be agreed to be undertaken by both parties. The outcome of the mediation remains confidential within the mediation group.

ACTION: Bruce to approach Frank Comato as a possible mediator.

ACTION: Bruce to collect statements from observers/witnesses

ACTION: Bruce to notify complainee re complaint received.

6.Office of Recreation & Sport Strategic Plan

- Leighlan attended launch. Some points noted were:
 - Attracting a business mindset for sporting groups
 - Making SA an "Active" state, with all sports *DOING* things in the state.
 - National Sporting Plan, to standardise sporting systems/groups in each state, is under consultation.
